Through a unique two-year immersion program crafted over 90 years, the Institute of Current World Affairs (ICWA) has transformed the lives and careers of emerging writers, academics, attorneys and diplomats, as well as experts from the fields of finance, policy and social activism. A prestigious ICWA Fellowship provides recipients with the rare gift of time and freedom to explore a region, research a topic and expand their ideas at a formative time in their lives. ICWA Fellowship recipients then join a growing community of distinguished professionals who make vital contributions to their fields.

IMMERSIVE GLOBAL FELLOWSHIPS

ICWA Fellows are handpicked from a highly competitive applicant pool, with interests ranging from women's health, climate change and immigration to arts, politics, conflict and human rights. The traits they share are intense curiosity, a passion for exploration, and openness to new perspectives. ICWA supports Fellows for two full years of study without interruption in a location of their choosing outside the United States. This intensive immersion experience, free from deadlines and career pressures, enables ICWA Fellows to cultivate their talent and engage with their subject — and themselves — in ways that have a profound impact on their lives and careers.

While in the field, Fellows receive support and mentoring from ICWA staff, former Fellows and ICWA members. Through monthly newsletters, ICWA Fellows share their evolving insights and activities. These dispatches from the field are a valuable exercise in writing and reflection and provide a window into the Fellowship experience for ICWA members. After two years, ICWA Fellows return to the United States, ready to impart the lessons and concepts that their Fellowships have inspired.

Apply for an ICWA Fellowship

ICWA provides two-year immersive fellowships for promising individuals early in their careers. The application begins with a letter of interest in which applicants briefly describe what they would do if they had a Fellowship, and why they're the right person to carry it out. If that resonates, they are invited to submit a full application.

INVESTING IN PEOPLE AND ADVANCING UNDERSTANDING

Over nearly a century, ICWA has produced a steady roster of highly accomplished Fellows with a deeply developed global perspective who go on to distinguished careers in journalism, law, diplomacy, social activism, economic development and other fields.

ICWA was founded by Charles R. Crane, a friend and financial supporter of Woodrow Wilson and member of the U.S. delegation to the 1919 Versailles Peace Conference. In Versailles, Crane observed that the American delegates lacked the global awareness and knowledge of their British and French counterparts. He left determined to create a corps of broadminded young Americans who understood the world and could use that knowledge to shape U.S. policy. In 1925, he founded ICWA to make that vision a reality.

Crane's legacy is an Institute that invests in people, launching them on a lifelong journey of activism, innovation and leadership, and enabling them to make contributions felt over decades.
